We have had an excellent start to the Summer term. As always following a break, the children have returned to school superbly well. They have quickly settled back into classroom routines and have demonstrated excellent behaviour for learning. New Learning Challenges are already underway and the latest Curriculum Newsletter, with details of the children's learning this term, have been shared via the School Jotter APP. These Newsletters are very informative and share an insight into the learning that will be covered in all subjects and ways in which you can be involved in supporting your child at home. Please look out for Knowledge Organisers, which will be sent home in the children's homework books or Reading Records. Knowledge Organisers share key facts, key information, dates and any other relevant information about your child's main Learning Challenge. They are a useful tool to use at home when discussing your child's learning and a great way to explore new learning together.

Already this term the children have taken part in visits and welcomed visitors into school to enhance their learning. Year 3 and 4 visited Bempton Cliffs on a very windy and wet day! The children were super ambassadors for the school and impressed all adults with their knowledge. They extended their learning about coasts and were able to see real life examples of the Geography features they have been studying in class. Year 3 and 4 have also had Katherine (a History specialist) visit for an enrichment day based on their current History challenge – Ancient Egypt. The children had a 'hands on' experience day which has supported them further in their historic learning.

Assessments for the Summer Term

During the Summer term there are a number of statutory assessments which are completed in school. Our Year 6 children will take their SATs tests from the 13th May and information regarding these tests has been shared with parents/carers. We wish all of our Year 6 children the very best of luck and are extremely proud of their positive attitudes to learning. The children have prepared for their tests and worked as hard as they possibly could, up to this point. We must also remember that SATs only tell us one factor of a child's ability on that one day of the year. They do not tell us some of the amazing things your children excel at in other areas of the curriculum.

The Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) will be taken by the Year 4 children, from the 4th June until 14th June. The purpose of the MTC is to make sure the children's times tables knowledge is at the expected level. The children will have looked at the format of the test online with Mrs Hoyle and Mrs Lewer.

Year 1 will complete the statutory Phonics Screening Check during the last half term. This will be completed from Monday 10th June on a 1:1 basis with Miss Midgley (our Reading Lead). The Phonics Screening Check is designed to check whether children understand phonics to an expected standard. Our daily phonics sessions really support the children in being able to complete the screening to the best of their ability.

If you have any further questions regarding any of the assessments mentioned above, please do not hesitate to raise them with your child's class teacher. Results from the assessments mentioned above will be shared with parents/carers in your child's end of year report on Friday 5th July.

Homework / Numbots / TT Rockstars

Our homework expectations are outlined in the Homework Overview which can be found on our website in the parents/carers section — learning at home. We wanted to take this opportunity to remind parents/carers how important the Maths element of your child's homework is. If your child is confident with number bonds and their times tables up to 12×12 as they move through school, it really does make many other mathematical concepts much easier to grasp and master.

The suggested amount of time the children should access the Maths online platforms for each week is shown below:

Year Reception and Year 1 = 10 minutes per week on Numbots.

Year 2 – Year 6 = 20 minutes per week (Year 2 – Numbots and Year 3-6 - Time Tables Rockstars).

KS2 children (Year 3-6) who are not accessing these online maths platforms, for the expected time above, will be encouraged to attend a lunch club to complete their weekly time on these platforms. We thank you in advance for your support in this area.

Parent/Carer Survey Results

We have really appreciated parents/carers completing our Parent View Survey. Feedback via the survey is vitally important to us to enable us to move forward and review our practice. The children have also been completing a survey in school. There are lots of positive aspects of school life which the children have referred to.
